

Schlesinger Asks New Kennedy Probe

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) — Historian Arthur M. Schlesinger Jr. said Monday night that doubts raised in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy warrant reopening the matter.

Schlesinger, who served Mr. Kennedy as a White House assistant, made his remarks in an interview at the University of Mississippi before addressing an Omicron Delta Kappa Mortor Board forum.

He said that it "appears to me substantial facts and doubts do exist, which would warrant a very intensive inquiry." He suggested a commission established by Congress as the best means. *End*
