

The Warren Report *Lee*

If all evidence, when considered, is as clear-cut as supporters of the Warren Commission Report maintain that it is, then there can be no reasonable doubt that Lee Harvey Oswald was the only person involved in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

If it is that clear-cut, then there can be no reasonable objection to a review of all ascertainable facts, complete transcripts of the Warren Commission hearings including all testimonies, and all evidence and exhibits

held in the national archives or elsewhere, by a totally objective private citizen fact-finding committee. Such a review should have the beneficial effect of clearing doubts once and for all.

If, on the other hand, the evidence is not that clear-cut, and if there is reason to doubt or to question the conclusions of the Warren Commission, then perhaps there is good and valid reason to re-open the matter to a new and independent investigation.
