

Jack Ruby will give a lie detector test if he, his doctors and defense and state lawyers all agree to such a test, Col. Homer Garrison, head of the Texas Department of Public Safety, indicated in Austin. Ruby, seriously ill with cancer at Parkland Hospital in Dallas, has requested the detector test.

Ruby wants to prove that he was not part of a conspiracy when he killed Lee Harvey Oswald, the assassin of President John F. Kennedy. Some experts have questioned whether lie detector tests now would be valid in view of Ruby's deteriorated physical condition. END
