INCA, a nonprofit, anti-Communist educational organization based in New Orleans, said Audio Fidelity Records, Inc., of New York had planned to it day to start distributing a record album containings the recording.

The tape was made by William K. Stuckey, then a New Orleans newsman, Aug. 17, 1963, about three, months before Oswald killed Mr. Kennedy. INCA Director Edward S. Butler III said his orga

nization bought the tape from Stuckey Oct. 21, 1964 Stuckey appeared hefore the Warren Commission which investigated the assassination and a trans cript of the report was included in the commission
