# RUBY SAYS IN TAPE NO PLAN EXISTED

## He Denies in Recording That Oswald Had Been in Club

In a tape-recorded conversation less than a month before his death, Jack Ruby told his brother that he had no recollection of the moment in which he fatally shot Lee Harvey Oswald.

The three-minute conversation was recorded in Ruby's maximum security room at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas sometime between last week's 15 and 18.

It will be part of a long-playing record entitled "The Controversy: The Death and the Warren Report" being produced by Capitol Records.

It was played publicly for the first time yesterday at a news conference in the American Hotel called by officials of the record company.

The record company spokesman said the taping was made with the help of Ruby's brother-in-law, who carried a recorder concealed in a dispatch case to the hospital room past unsuspecting police guards.

The record company's representatives declined to say who had arranged for the recording to be made.
