

President Johnson was asked to overrule a Kennedy family attorney and allow Rep. Theodore R. Kupferman (R-N.Y.) to examine X rays and photographs, now in the National Archives, taken at the autopsy on President John F. Kennedy. In a letter to Mr. Johnson, Kupferman said he wanted to see if the material would add any information on whether more than one person was involved in the assassination. Kupferman said Burke Marshall, attorney for the executors of Mr. Kennedy's estate, had refused to let him see the material.
