Not Satisfied, Aide to Garrison Says

NEW ORLEANS (A)—
Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's
chief assistant said Thursday night release of a
panel review on the autopsy of President John F.

Kennedy "doesn't satisfy us."

James Alcock said the district attorney's office would still press for release of the full autopsy report, including photographs and Xrays, at a court hearing in Washington today.

Garrison's of five has subpoenaed the photographs and Xrays for the trial of Clay L. Shaw, charged by the district attorney with conspiring to assassinate Mr. Kennedy.

Garrison was not available for comment.
