

## Not Satisfied, Aide to Garrison Says

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—  
Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's  
chief assistant said Thurs-  
day night release of a  
panel review on the autop-  
sy of President John F.

Kennedy "doesn't satisfy  
us."

James Alcock said the  
district attorney's office  
would still press for re-  
lease of the full autopsy  
report, including photo-  
graphs and Xrays, at a  
court hearing in Washing-  
ton today.

Garrison's office has  
subpoenaed the photo-  
graphs and Xrays for the  
trial of Clay L. Shaw,  
charged by the district  
attorney with conspiring  
to assassinate Mr. Kenne-  
dy.

Garrison was not avail-  
able for comment. *end*
