Chief Shaw Counsel F. Irvin Dymond said Mrs. Mc-Maines is important because she denies a story told by Russo, 26, at the preliminary hearing. Russo testified he took Sandra to a party in September 1963 at the Louisiana Ave. Parkway-apartment of David William Ferrie. While there, Russo said, he heard Shaw, Ferrie and Oswald plotting to kill Kennedy.

Ferrie, who died here Feb. 22, 1967, has been named by Garrison as a key figure in the alleged assassination plot. Oswald was named by the Warren Commission as Kennedy's lone assassin.

DETAILS OF the party, Russo testified, remained vague in his memory until he relived the occasion with the aid of a hypnotist provided by Garrison.
