

## L.B.J. to Give Account of Dallas Events

For the first time since the assassination of John F. Kennedy, former President Lyndon B. Johnson will give his own account of the events in Dallas and his assumption of the Presidency, on "L.B.J.: Tragedy and Transition," airing May 2 on CBS.

"L.B.J.: Tragedy and Transition," the third in a series of conversations between Mr. Johnson and CBS correspondent Walter Cronkite, is described by producer John Sharnik as "The first opportunity to hear about the events of that tragic day in Dallas and of the period of transition that followed from the man who was both an eyewitness and a principal. In the motorcade, his vantage point was two cars behind President Kennedy. And from the moment of Kennedy's death, he became the focus of events as the successor to the Presidency."
