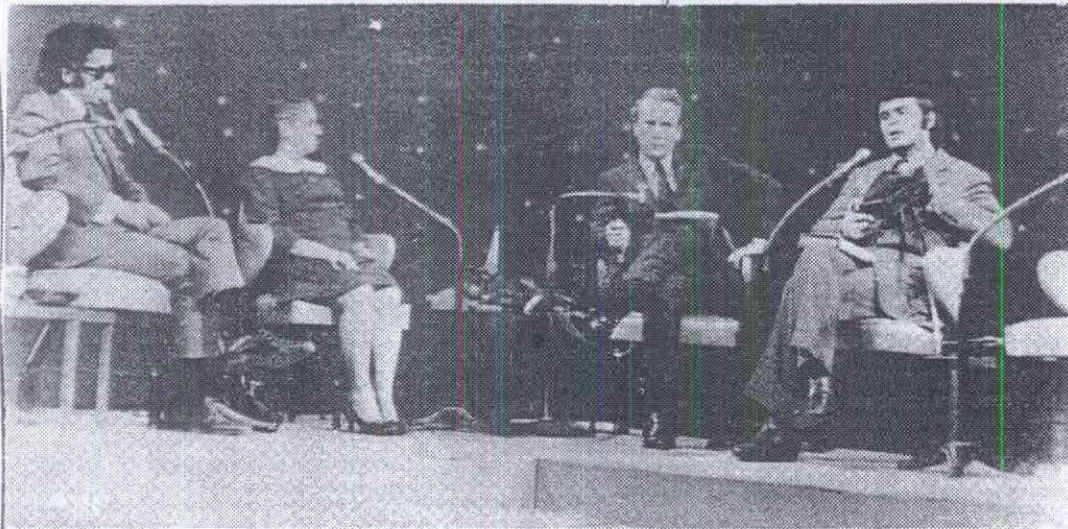

KTLA cancels show on RFK probe

KTLA-TV (channel 5), after scheduling a special, in-depth interview on the Robert K. Dornan Show with investigative reporter Theodore Charach, members of the Sirhan family, and Karl Uecker, a key witness in the Sirhan trial, has abruptly cancelled the program this week.

Charach has made public startling new information on the assassination of Senator Robert Kennedy. Charach's findings were discussed on the Dornan show on June 27. At that time Dornan stated that he would definitely in-

vite Charach and the other guests for a second appearance the following Saturday.

Charach received calls last week from KTLA-TV informing him that the entire RFK assassination investigation would be examined in detail on a special show Saturday, July 18, with tapings set for July 17 at 7:30 p.m.

However, according to Charach, a producer of the Dornan show was told by KTLA management that if Dornan persisted in bringing the Sirhans back on the show, the show just might be cancelled

permanently.

Charach has developed new evidence that Sirhan Sirhan could not have fired the shots that killed Senator Kennedy. Karl Uecker also has given testimony that Sirhan did not fire the bullet that killed Kennedy.
