Dear Mr Lesar

Some two months or so ago I was informed by Harold Weisberg that he had passed on to you my request for help in acquiring copies of the Mary Moorman photo, the Altgens photo, a photo of the 'magic bullet' in profile, and any other shots you may be able to provide me with.

To date I have not heard from you, and I would like to know if you are able to help or not. If you are not able to get copies of these prints for me I shall have to try elsewhere. (Do you have any suggestions?)

I have a couple of local newspapers interested in taking copy from me for publication to mark the thirtieth anniversary of the assassination. I have very few photos dealing with the assassination that I can supply with my articles and the few I have were all given to me by Harold Weisberg (I have already used them as illustrations in the two articles I have had published so far).

Most of what I know about the assassination, and the official cover up, I have learnt through my correspondence with Harold Weisberg. We have been exchanging letters for about the last two years. He has very generously taken the time to answer a long string of questions that I could not find answers to in the many books I have now read on the subject.
