Axstrategy of seige and a war of attrition.

Beginning in May 1864. The battles of the campaign:

Wilderness

Spottsyvania Ct. House

Cold Harbor

Ends w/ great seige

In the first six weeks Grant lost 60,000 men; that was 50% of his army. The CSA losses were proportionally high but unlike the Union Lee had no replacements.

At Cold Harbor Grant lost 7,000 men in less than an hour. The Cold Harbor "syndrome"/ soldiers adopt "dog tags."
