**Clark 'Very Optimistic'  
Ray Will Be Captured**

WASHINGTON, May 12 (UPI) — Attorney General Ramsey Clark said today that James Earl Ray, sought in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, was alive. He said he was "very optimistic" that Ray would be captured.

Mr. Clark interviewed on the American Broadcasting Company's television program "Issues and Answers," said he had found no evidence to believe that he is not still alive. Mr. Clark said, "I believe we will find him," Clark said.
