The obvious point is Hosty's failure to take action. He simply filed the note away in an "Oswald" folder in his desk. And the Dallas Office SAC Shanklin and his assistant Howe were not alarmed by what was in the note until Kennedy's assassination when all hell broke loose.

Orders from FBI SOG to Dallas to destroy the note.

THE WHAT IFS ABOUND HERE:

@ Does it make sense if Oswald was planning an attempt on JFK's life did it make sense for him to draw the attention of the FBI and authorities to himself just days before Kennedy's trip to Dallas?

The issue goes to Motive. (Next week I ask you to examine how the WC handles the question of motive).

- @ What if Hosty, under instructions from his superiors reported the note to the Secret Service. Would it have made a difference in terms of presidential security on 11/22? Especially since Oswald worked in a building overlooking the presidential motorcade route's through the city that day.
 - @ Throw in one more that I did not have when I wrote "Breach."
