Re: Notes with "Who Was Oswald"

@ In October 1962 Oswald settled in Dallas and got a job at Jagers-Chiles-Stovall Co. Some of the company's contracts were with the U.S. Army Map Service. Some of the work going on at JCJ in the fall of 1962 was classified and related to top secret U-2 missions. These missions were directed to make maps for the US planes flying over Cuba the month of the Cuban Missile Crisis. Oswald was involved in this work.

Caveat here: If Oswald had been a defector to Russia and then sometime after he returned to the USA he finds employment with an outfit that is doing super-sensitive Government intelligence work (CIA possibly).

Makes one think.

@ In April 1963 Oswald moved to New Orleans. He found employment at the Reily Coffee Company. The owner, Reily had worked for the CIA for years. He was an importer of coffee from Latin America and had contacts all over the place.

@ Case of Jim Wilcott and his wife Elsie. Wilcott worked in the finance branch of the Tokyo CIA Station, 1960-1964. On March 22, 1978 this former CIA accountant under oath testified before the HSCA and reported that he had reason to believe that Oswald was a "regular employee" of the CIA, and that he believed Oswald "received a full-time salary for agent work for doing CIA operational work." He was told by a CIA employee that money he (Wilcott) had dispersed was for "the Oswald project or for Oswald." This source revealed Oswald's cover name or identification and Wilcott recalled he had dispersed funds for this

@ Historian Michael Kurtz and Dean of the Graduate School at Southeastern Louisiana University in New Orleans, was a longtime resident in the Big Easy.

He knew a lot of people in New Orleans. One of them was the CIA's Station Chief for the NO's Office. Leake told Kurtz the following:

Leake stated that on the day after JFK assassination, he was ordered to collect all the New Orleans's Office Oswald files and send them to CIA HQers in Langley. That order came from Helms, the Deputy Director of Plans (the de facto head of the CIA) ordered that they be transferred and ultimately destroyed.

Leake also reported that Oswald performed chores for the CIA during his 5 months in New Orleans. Leaks said he personally paid Oswald various sums of money for his services.
