- @ Note that Oswald as a Marine radar operator when serving at El Toro air defense system in California. . . . His commanding officer, a Capt. Donovan confirmed that Oswald had "secret clearance." He also had some positive things to say about Oswald's job performance.
- @ A historian I know indirectly, Michael Kurtz ("The JFK Assassination Debates," 2006. Un. Of Kansas Press).

Kurtz is dean of the graduate school at Southeastern Louisiana University. The school is located in New Orleans. Kurtz knows the NO scene pretty well. . . .

Long after the Kennedy assassination Kurtz had interviews with a CIA officer who was head of the Agency's office in New Orleans. His name was Hunter Leake. Leake told him that on the day after the assassination Richard Helms, the agency's deputy director of plans (de facto guy running the Agency called Leake and told him to bring all the New Orleans records on Oswald to CIA Hqers in Langley, Virginia.

Leake told Kurtz that the haul New Orleans files on Oswald was so voluminous that he had to rent a trailer to haul them to Virginia. He speculated that the records were destroyed.
