(13) Page 330 - Mr. O. V. Campbell during interview on 11-20-63, in part stated that while he did not observe anyone fire any shots from his building there was an individual wearing a construction-type hat who indicated he had seen an individual fire from the building and that this individual was being interviewed by a police officer who was apparently taking his name. If not already done efforts should be made to locate and interview this construction worker.

(14) Pages 329, 333 and 364 - Your attention is directed to the interviews of Frank Pizzo, 131 Audrey and particularly Albert G. Degard. As you are aware investigation fails to indicate Oswald had any ability at driving a motor vehicle or that he had a license. The statements attributed to Degard indicate the subject was capable of driving at speeds of 45 to 65 miles per hour. It would be in complete disagreement with the known facts. The purpose of these individuals furnishing this information is not known, however, the possibility should not be overlooked that they furnished false information to the FBI for some devious reason. Reinterview with Degard should be conducted, a signed statement obtained and the possible use of the polygraph considered. It is possible a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1001 exists.

(15) Page 371 - Mr. William H. Sholley during interview states on the morning of 11-22-63, Oswald appeared at work as usual. Insure your investigation established whether he or any other individual arriving at work at about that time observed Oswald carrying the brown paper bag believed to have contained the rifle used in the assassination. Further, you should determine whether there is any way of signing in by employees and insure that individuals signing in at about the same time as Oswald are appropriately interviewed. It would appear logical that all employees working at the Texas School Book Depository Building on 11-22-63, should be interviewed therefore direct your investigative efforts accordingly.
