Evidence

On 12/2/63, the following additional evidence was received by the Laboratory from the Dallas Office:

1. Gray man's jacket, ^{reportedly} found in the vicinity in which Officer J. D. Tippit was shot
2. Four fired .38 Special caliber cartridge cases ^{believed to have been fired} in the vicinity in which Officer Tippit was shot
3. Four unfired .38 Special caliber cartridges removed from the revolver taken from Oswald at the time of his apprehension
4. Five unfired .38 Special caliber cartridges found in the trousers pocket of Oswald
5. A wrist watch and ring taken from Oswald at the time of his apprehension
6. Ten fired 6.5 mm rifle cartridge cases furnished by the owner of the Sports Dome Gun Range, Dallas, Texas, to determine whether these cartridge cases were fired in the rifle recovered from the Texas Public School Book Depository building

The four cartridge cases have been identified as having been fired in the .38 Special Smith and Wesson revolver, Serial No. V510210, taken from Oswald at the time of his apprehension.

No firing pin impressions are present on the unfired nine cartridges and no markings are present on the cartridges for identification of the cartridges with the revolver.

No latent fingerprints were found on the cartridge cases or cartridges.

A visible laundry marking which appears to be "30 030" was found on the collar of the jacket. No invisible laundry markings were found on the jacket.

The jacket is composed of light gray cotton fibers. No fibers similar to these were found among the fibers previously removed from the butt plate of the 6.5 mm Mannlicher-Carcano rifle found in the Texas Public School Book Depository building. Dark blue, gray-black and orange-yellow cotton fibers were found in debris removed from the inside areas of the sleeves of the jacket. These fibers match in microscopic characteristics the dark blue, gray-black and orange-yellow cotton fibers composing the shirt of Oswald.

No significant residues were found on the watch or ring.

It was determined that the ten rifle cartridge cases were not fired in the 6.5 mm Mannlicher-Carcano rifle.
