

EARLY EVIDENCE FILE

1. FBI Lab Report 12/16/'63 62-109060-4180--Bulky (Part II, 006) P. 2 notes that the paper of specimens Q265 and Q266 were found to be different "in observable physical characteristics from the paper of specimen Q10" . . . Q10 is identified as wrapping paper in the shape of a large paper bag "which was previously submitted and believed to have contained the assassination weapon." Attached page 62-109060-4180, 12/16/'63, Bulky, Part II 007. Goes on to note that Q10 was delivered personally to the Lab by Agent Drain on 11/23/'68. . . Paper Bag was a FBI construction to frame the dead Oswald. . .
2. Some indication that the FBI was not rock hard certain the gun in the back yard photo was the same weapon used in the Kennedy assassination . . .
3. In this collection of FBI paper several docs disclose that the paper sac K 22 paper and tape of this sack not identical w/ K52 the replica made from the The paper in the shipping room of TSB. . .(check w. Hal on this issue for the guy who ran this operation . . .
4. Griffith to Conrad 12/2/'63 that Oswald's revolver was the gun used in the Tippit killing. . .62-109060-4180, Bulky 050.

FBI Lab Report, 1226/'63 ^2-109060-4180 Bulky. . .p. 2 notes that Oswald's jacket (Q 350) did not turn up any indication of gun powder residue—no nitrates or nitrites turned up in lab testing. . notes that this wasnot exonerating because nitrates and nitrites "are normally deposited on a shooter's clothing." See p. 3 where FBI notes that jacket in question was later discovered in the TSB. . . where workers normally hung up their outer garments when reporting to work!!!!
