SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

Mr. Jack Miller, Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, called and advised that he was fully aware of the intensive investigation being conducted by the Bureau and that he was certain that the Bureau's work would undoubtedly bolster the charge brought by the District Attorney in Dallas, Texas. He indicated that the Department would appreciate receiving something in writing at such time the information is available.

Mr. Miller was advised that there were ramifications in this matter to be run out to the fullest extent and that nothing had been reduced to writing at this time. His request would be borne in mind in regard to furnishing the Department something in writing at the earliest possible time.

No commitment of any type was made to Miller as to when a memorandum in writing would be made available.
