ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY,

The following investigation was conducted by SA MALON L. JENNINGS, SA B. TOM CARTER, and SA ROBLEY D. AT PORT WORTE, TEXAS

On 11/23/63, JAMES A. BYRON, News Director, WBAP-TV, made available for review TV movie film shot by his employees and MBC photographers on or about the time of the KENNEDY assassination in Dallas, Texas, on 11/22/63.

A review of the film did not disclose any pictures of the building where President KENNEDY was allegedly shot from until this particular act had been in committed. After President KENNEDT was shot, the film did contain several frames of the building which are of no particular significance at this time. With regard to people running from the building or people possibly seen in the building as alleged by persons 150 viewing this film on television when first shown by MBC, Mr. BYRON pointed out that this film was first run without being edited and, of course, the sequence of might indicate to viewers that the building scene was taken at the time of the assassination, which is not

Mr. BYRON advised that MBC photographers film and the station's own photographers' films were run together as one since this is an NBC station. He pointed out that the NBC photographer shooting film shortly after the shooting of the President was DAVE WEIGHAN. WEIGHAN was riding in a car approximately five cars back of the President. He apparently heard. the shooting, jumped out of his car, and with his

DL 89-43 movie camera shooting film ran up to the vicinity of the President's car. During this period there are shown what appears to be people running from buildings, but the building in question here was one block away and not included on this film which was taken by WEIGHAM. and not included on this lilm which was taken by arround. Further, people are shown running or lying on the ground because of the shooting, and some of this is shown on the film taken by WEIGHAN.

Mr. BYRON advised that should any film come to his attention which would possibly aid the FBI in this case, he would immediately notify the FBI, extend his fullest cooperation, and make any film available for FBI use.
