Dr. Vincent P. Orton, head of the Surface Activation Analysis Section of General Atomic Division, General Dynamics Corporation, San Diego, California, and his associates have been studying methods of detection of powder residues by neutron activation analysis for the past few years. They have received contracts from the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) to conduct research on this matter. Until the assassination of President Kennedy all their research work was conducted on residues left from the firing of hand weapons.

Today Dr. Vincent P. Orton called the FBI Laboratory and spoke to Agent John F. Gallagher. His call was incoming from Chicago, Illinois. He advised that since the assassination a large part of their efforts have been directed to the determination of powder residues on cartridge cases taken from the hands and chests of individuals who have shot a rifle similar to the one reportedly used by Lee Harvey Oswald. He advised that there appears that triple firing of this rifle will leave numerous positive tests every time on the cartridge case. He further expects that testing the case with alpha-irradiation does not affect the characteristic elements (barium) but such testings do not remove all of the other characteristic elements in powder residues (carbon).

Further he advised that the tests to date indicate that powder residues are deposited on both sides of the bullet after the bullet is fired either one time or three times.

It appears, he said, that these results can be obtained even if the powder tests are made 24 hours after shooting the rifle providing that the side of the shooter had not been washed in the meantime.

It is to be expected that washing the casings with diethylbenzidine does remove some of the characteristic elements (barium) but such washing do not remove all of the other characteristic element in powder residues (strontium).

Further he advised that the tests to date indicate that powder residues are deposited on both sides of the bullet after the rifle is fired either one time or three times.

It appears, he added, that these results can be obtained even if the bullet casings are made 24 hours after shooting the rifle providing that the sides of the bullet had not been washed in the meantime.
