

C., 11/9/63, referring to a visit to Boviet Embassy, Mexico, and stated was unable to remain in Mexico indefinitely as he had enly a 5-day permit. He mid he could not take a chance at requesting a new visa unless he used his real name. Hence, returned to the U.S.A. Stated he had not planned to enter Boviet Embassy in Mexico so they were not prepared and adds that had he been able to enter Boviet Embassy in Havana as planned, the Embassy there would have been time to complete "our business".
