I dery is appreciate the interest which prompted your letter of Liecember 1711, with esclosure, and want to thank you for your expression of confidence, as well as your thoughtful prayers.

Your concern for the reputation of Texas and for the police authorities in Dollas is certainly understandable and is shared by me. Because of my desire that all the facts be known, I have appointed a Presidential Commission to look into all aspects of the tragic events in Syr. Callas.

"With regard to the actions of the FBI and the Secret Service G in Pallas, they have specific responsibilities defined by Federal statutes and Executive Orders. They cannot lawfully exceed the authority granted them. For this reason these sgencies could not "take over" from the Dallas Folice Department which was handling a criminal matter within its jurisdiction. Under existing legislation neither of these Federal agencies had lawful authority to have unetody of or to participate in guarling and transporting Leg. Harvey Dawald.

In accordance with my instructions, the FBI is thoroughly investigating and has submitted its initial report to the Presidential Commission. The FBI has continually promptly advised the Secret Service of all information in its possession indicating a potential danger to the President of the United States or his family.
