11/22/63 W.A. Branigan to W.C. Sullivan memo, apparently Serial 76 of indistinguishable file was reviewed 1/2 o5 1/6/77, when it was stamped as exempt from GDS Categories 1,1 and3 for an indefinite period. The first page is all in the public Warren material.

P. 2 has Oswald saying 6-26-62 that "he did not care to relive the past." My recollections is unclear. Is this in the Fain report? If not there is a record the release of which I do not recall.

Same for his not having gone to Russia from admiration for system.

P. 3 pretends the FBI NO had no knowledge of the Oswald arrest until it read the papers, and that it learned of the arrest from the papers.

P. 4, in context, unless there is a confidential informant the half page would not seem to be subject to withholding. In addition, if this is info from a confidential informant, with LHO dead in particular it would seem that there is reasonably segregable matter in a half page, especially with the marginal question in Hoover's hand, "Why not? 11/25"

This also says that LHO drank to excess in Fort Worth. Should I remember having read this in a released report? I do not recall it.

But if he did, what does that do to his very tight (W.C. style) family hudget? Which Priscilla McMillan also wrecked.
