(Call to Chief Justice Warren concerning derogatory article on Chief Justice)

Chief Justice Warren asked that I see him in his office on 11/14/66 at 3 p.m. At the time he advised me that several days previously he had received a call from the above-named individual who told him there was a sinister plot to print a scurrilous article concerning Warren.

The Chief Justice handed me the attached letter dated 11/3/66. [redacted] indicates a contract has been signed, with [redacted] hands.

[redacted] this matter has all the earmarks of a very unsavory plot and that the Chief Justice can sense the implications these parties are trying to give.

[redacted] the Chief Justice he feels compelled to advise him of this matter. He then, in his letter, refuses to reveal the identities of the parties in question, but intimates he would like to be employed by the U. S. Diplomatic Service in Denmark.

Chief Justice Warren advised me he was not concerned about this matter, inasmuch as numerous people have attacked him in the past and he realizes in his position such attacks will continue. He stated his father was murdered and the murderer has never been found. He advised that he, of course, had nothing to do with this matter; however, considerable speculation has arisen over the years in view of the high position of the Chief Justice.

Chief Justice Warren stated his principal reason in contacting the FBI was to make [redacted] telephone call and letter a matter of record. He stated also that if the FBI had any information concerning [redacted] or the plot to embarrass Warren he would certainly appreciate being advised. He indicated he did not want to ask us to do anything which would be beyond the regular scope of our work; however, any information that could be furnished would be very much appreciated.

The San Francisco Office was asked to make a discreet check of [redacted]

The Senior Resident Agent in Santa Rosa has known [redacted] for several years and indicates he is a stable, reputable individual. [redacted] In other words, there is no adverse information known about him and he is not known to be controversial in any manner.

ACTION:

It is suggested that the Senior Resident Agent, Santa Rosa, California, [redacted] and indicate that the FBI is discreetly looking into this matter to determine if there is a violation within FBI jurisdiction. [redacted]

[redacted] we will advise Chief Justice Warren of [redacted] background and of the fact that he refuses to furnish information to the FBI.
