*[redacted]* one of our sources in New York and a former newspaper man, called and talked to Mr. Kemper in my office.

He said that he had just heard over the radio that Oswald, subject in the assassination, had asked for John Abt to be his attorney. *[redacted]* said that we, of course, knew Abt's background and that he had taken the fifth amendment on several occasions and that Abel, the espionage agent, had also asked for Abt as his attorney.

*[redacted]* also pointed out that he thought it was very strange that Oswald was able to get his wife out of Russia.
