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Relevant backdrop:

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White was not on the flight w/ the Cabinet members he learned about this as a result of access to the flight tapes of AF-1. The passengers learn at 12:45 CST from a teletype message that "Three shots were fired at Pres. Kennedy's motorcade in downtown Dallas."

Robert Manning of the State Department was w/ Secretary Dean Rusk on noted that the party learned of JFK's death and that the assassin was somebody named Oswald who had been to the Soviet Union, had done this." This from Strober's "Let Us Begin Anew," an oral history of the Kennedy presidency. (pp. 50-51).

Pierre Salinger's written account of the news of the Kennedy's assassination in his manuscript at the Kennedy Library contained the time when the Cabinet plane learned of JFK's death and the name of his assassin is missing from the Kennedy Library.

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
