emorandum DATE: 11/23/63 R. H. Jevons ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT My earlier memorandum of today lists the items of evidence received in this matter to date. Among those items was the revolver scized from suspect Lee Harvey Oswald upon his arrest following the killing of Dallas police officer Tippett and the fatal bullet removed from Officer Tippett's The examination of these items is now complete. It has been determined that the bullet, a copper coated lead bullet of .38 Special caliber, is so badly mutilated that there are not sufficient marks on its surface to permit identification of the particular weapon from which it was fired. However, it was determined that the suspect's revolver is among those weapons producing rifling impressions of the number, type and size as those presently on the fatal bullet. The remaining examinations are in progress and you will be advised of the results immediately upon their completion. .ACTION: For information. - Mr. Tolson ADDENDUM: The latent fingerprint examinations in this matter have now been - Mr. Belmont completed. In addition to those results - Mr. Nohr previously reported to you, no latent prints of value were developed on Oswald's revolver, 1 - Mr. Rosen 1 - Mr. DeLoach the cartridge cases, rifle clip, inner parts 1 - Mr. Trotter of rifle or the unfired cartridge.
