Other facts developed through the evidence of the sixth-floor photographs clearly show that Oswald had a clear path to exit the sixth floor by running down the east wall of the Depository and then along the north wall of the building by the elevators. The short stacks of boxes that the gun was hidden behind indicate that Oswald leaned over them with the rifle in his right hand, placing it on the floor behind the stacks.

Oswald then turned around and ran down the small corner stairs to the second-floor lunchroom where he was seen by Dallas Officer Marion Baker. Baker stated that when he first observed Oswald he "caught a glimpse of this man . . . through this window in this door, . . . walking away from me, about 20 feet away from me in the lunchroom"⁴ (on the second floor). Oswald was not seen by Officer Baker sitting down eating his lunch as put forth by the "lone patsy" scenario.

One other extremely condemning fact pointing towards the guilt of Oswald is that immediately after the encounter with Officer Baker he walked out the front door of the Depository and left work.⁵ After a head count of Depository employees carried out following the Dallas police arrival, it was determined by the building superintendent, Roy Truly, that Oswald was not in the building. Truly then notified Police Homicide Captain Will Fritz, who was on the sixth floor, of the missing worker.⁵ Why would Oswald have left so quickly? It certainly makes sense that anyone firing a rifle at a presidential motorcade would flee the scene.

In order for the "lone patsy" scenario to be credible, it is necessary to believe that Oswald did not fire any shots. The palm print (seen by Rusty on the night of the assassination) would thus not have existed until three days later (remember Lieutenant Day stated that the palm print he had lifted was old and dry) and the partial fingerprints on the trigger housing examined today by Captain Powdrill would have never existed.

Researchers assert that the fingerprints found on the boxes were there because Oswald worked on the sixth floor. They contend
