downward through his right chest, exiting below his right nipple. This bullet passed through his right wrist and into his left thigh.

c. President Kennedy was struck a second time by a bullet which entered the right rear portion of his head, causing a massive and fatal wound.

6. There is not the slightest evidence that any person fired a rifle from the railroad bridge over the Triple Underpass, the railroad yards nearby, or any location other than the School Book Depository.

B. Based upon the examination of the wounds and the location of President Kennedy and Governor Connally at the time of the shots, the Commission has concluded that the same bullet probably caused the neck wound of President Kennedy and all of the wounds of Governor Connally.

C. The Commission has reached the following conclusions concerning the total number and time span of the shots:

- 1. The weight of the evidence indicates that there were probably three shots fired.
- 2. One of the shots probably missed the car and its occupants, but the Commission is unable to reach any firm conclusion as to which of the three shots missed.
