.Folder 9 A--Walker Shooting

- Hosty to Shanklin 11/22/1963 Note: I made a cross index of this to Fredda Scobey RG272 file. Point here: Hosty says that Dallas PD with warrant searched LHO's room on North Neeley and came up with phone numbers. One of these was General Walker's... My point was that Scobey said that search of Ruth Paine's garage/house was without a warrant....evidence would have been disallowed at a trial.
- 2. Heitman to SAC Dallas 12/3/1963 Notes Marina shown the Walker note today 12/3/1963 in Russian. She notes that when he returned that night he was trembling and very pale. . . .He didn't know if he hit the general and wanted to check the radio, etc. POINT: Here we have Oswald a bundle of nerves after the attempt on Walker compared to Oswald almost oversleeping on 11/22 when he was intent on shooting the president. Note: Marina states that she did not see him take the rifle out of the house or bringing it back into the Neeley St. address.

3. Rosen to Belmont 12/3/1963 This was day that the Russian note was allegedly discovered in the cook book at Ruth Paine's. Another fortuitous discovery. On this day the Walker slug now became the object of interest to the FBI. Not before. It was on its way to BuLab for examination. Attached is Belmont to Tolson 12/3/'63 relates development. See Belmont note: "run down vigorously."

3A The Katzenbach memo 11/25 In view of fact of Katz's the one who first raised the issue of possible tying Oswald to the Walker shooting to strengthen case against him for acting in violent manner. . . etc. It was Katz who first mused about tying Oswald to the Walker shooting. See his point 3. in the Memorandum for Moyers.

Jevons to Conrad 12/4/1963 Say that Walker bullet was 6.5 caliber fired from Mannlicher-Carcano rifle like one used in assassination with rifling characteristics same as M/C.... But because of the distortion of the bullet "it could not be determined whether or not the Walker bullet was fired from Oswald's rifle." These results were arrived at independently by three of the Bureau's top firearms experts.

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4A. Conrad to Belmont 12/4/'63 He suggested that since the Walker bullet was so distorted it might be possible to make a match if FBI could find any bullets fired from Oswald rifle (K1) fired around April 1963 the date of the Walker shooting.

He recovered rifle, took the shot, then buried it again. . . .Marina is spinning the tale. Why? To sell the story. . . .to pacify the govt. so she is not shipped back to Russia and losing her kids. . .

17A Insert here a 17A Notes that Dallas detective Bobby G. Brown was the one who obtained the Walker bullet from his residence fro9m "unknown officer at the Walker residence." The whole line of possession was botched from the outset. It would later be established that the officer was Norvell who had left the force for the military. Did he ever get contacted????

21. See addendum These are a series of Dallas Police reports on the Walker shooting that were reported on 4/10/'63 and following days when the case was in the hands of the Dallas police before the Walker shooting was politicized as part of the JFK assassination.
