MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

A confidential informant of known reliability has adviced as follows Martin Luther King:

In the Fall of 1964 following the remarks made to the press by the Director FBI regarding King and after King's center statement, an Assistant Director of the FBI visited one of the more responsible Negro-leaders in this country and advised him that the Director FDI was prepared to make specific charges agains King based on factual data in his possession to the effect that King had misused funds contributed to the Civil Rights movement for his personal of the GPUSA although he had promised other Negro leaders he would terminate the two

charges, and at first met with denials of them but subsequently King admitted that it looked as floughthe were in trouble. He asked for time to think the matter over and said he would see the following day. He did not appear as promised and later ascertained that King had gone to. Washington and made his peace with the Director FBI.

The foregoing information has been confirmed from another source with direct access to the Director FBI.
