

The affidavit with which these records were conveyed to the court and me was on legal size paper but we have been able to copy it on letter size.

Except where I've added the missing S (for Security) number these pages are exactly as I received them and are copied directly from the records provided to me by the CIA.

A few comments, which do not include comments on the incredible political beliefs of the CIA's source.

While S-21 records that the subject is unwilling to be turned over to the FBI he did not refuse absolutely. On page 6 there is a reference to this subject's source as a DJ official. That was Sullivan's operation. While I do not have the withheld name, that of Joseph A. Sizoo fits. He is described in FBI records as Inspector (which was probably later) and as Sullivan's No. 1 man in the domestic intelligence division. During Watergate it came out that what is here described was physically in Sullivan's office until he turned it over to the Nixon White House.

S-23 reports another such source who saw the subject at his New York home 7/13/65. This and other such dating data makes it possible for anyone who keeps the kinds of records professionals usually keep to establish that he was not the subject if in fact he was not.
