Unless he has some suggestions, I would think it would be perfectly proper on your part to write to a number of publishers of paperback books, calling attention to the fact that the Warren Commission's inquiry has caused a new interest because of the facts which came from the Senate Investigations Committee regarding the FBI and CIA and the current investigation conducted by the House Committee. While the House Committee investigation is still going forward, every indication is that it will reach the same result as the Warren Commission. In fact, members have already made such public statements.

I do not know any publishing companies or I would write them myself. If you write such companies and want me to follow up with a letter as a former member of the Commission, I will be happy to do so.
