Mr. JAMES UNDERWOOD, newsman, KRLD-TV, Dallas, advised that he had taken 16 millimeter movie films in the area of the Texas School Book Depository Building at 411 Elm Street, on November 22, 1963, immediately after the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY.

He advised that during the time that he was in the area on November 22, 1963, a Deputy Sheriff whom he does not recall had pointed out a mark on the curbing on the south side of Main Street near the triple underpass. UNDERWOOD stated that the mark was fresh and, in his opinion, it could have been caused by a bullet striking the curb. He stated that the cement was not broken; however, the object that struck the curb had hit it with such force that it left a fresh white mark.

UNDERWOOD related that on Saturday, November 23, 1963, he was assigned to stand by at the Dallas County Jail to cover the possible transfer of LEE HARVEY OSWALD from the Dallas Police Department Jail to the County Jail. He advised that after remaining near the jail entrance for a length of time, he decided to walk down to the triple underpass and take movie film of the mark. He advised that to the best of his recollection, the mark must have been approximately twenty to twenty-
