The bill was rendered by the manager, a man I knew well, whose name is illegible in

the bill rendered under date of Farch 10 to the Commission, Account No. G-7883.

11,12, 20, 21,22, 24 and 27. The transcripts for February 4,5 and 6 were marked "rush delivery" and billed at the rate of 53.05 per page instead of the standard rate of

22 is separate and at the bottom of the bill.

It reads "No write-up (reporter's notes confiscated by Commission) pages estimated 30."

The FS ca charge per page was \$ 30.825.

At the bottom the bill is notarized, apprently because "The above procedings were classified as TOP AECRET." The manager/affiant was Wayne Birdsell.

This record, from the Commission's files, has a notation on it. One reads, "3-27-Hr. Ward called to ask when might receive payment." Three days later there was a return call informing the Mr. Ward who must be the son of the Jesse War I knew in the 1930s, twilling him that the bill was processed for payment March 17 and it usually took about 10 working days for the processing.

Also attached to this bill is a typed statement by Kankin's secretary:

2/7/64 - 10:30 a.m.

Mr. Elmer Moore of Secret Service took all as waste material delivered by Ward & Paul to date to be burned with other waste matter at the White House and under supervision of White House Police.
