Re: Larry Schiller and Richard W. Lewis (1966-1967)

SM to LS/RL, Dec. 4, 1966

Re: SM writes that she declines being associated with their project to do a documentary album for Capitol Records of the critics of the WCR. She explains why she disassociates herself from this project. SM smells a "rat" in the whole thing. She was impressed w/ Schiller because he was young and good looking. They were at her apartment for four hours "picking her brain." She infers in letter that they could be the real scavengers who are out to exploit the JF assassination for money. She gives her reasons. These are tied to the contracts that she was asked to sign. One of these had language that would have permitted them to essentially have her say anything they wanted her to say about the assassination.

Good letter if the Sciller/Lewis thing is used.

SM mentions that she has made herself available to check mss. for accuracy and has commissioned articles without remuneration.

SM to Maggie(Field), HW, and Ray[Marcus]. Jan. 5, 1967
