I have received your letter of June 10, 1976, and appreciate the continued interest in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., which prompted you to write.

You undoubtedly will be pleased to know that data Concerning evidence recovered in Memphis, Tennessec, and sofit to the FBI Laboratory for examination have been released is response to requests received by us under the Freedom of Information Act. If you will write or telophone him at (202) 3:4-5359, Assistant Director Donald W. Moore, Jr., of our ternal Affairs Division will make arrangements for you to riview this material.

Presumably your desire to discuss the Invaders group nich existed in Memphis at the time of Dr. King's murder stems from the article you wrote for the February 1, 1976, issue of Jawsday. At my instruction, a thorough search was made of pentinent files at our Headquarters, as well as in our Hemphis Morald Office, immediately after that article was published. It resulted in no substantiation being found for the allegations which served as the basis for your article: namely, that "Several FBI informants...were among the most active nombers" of the Invaders and that "FDI informants actively Dee AD Adm participated in the rioting" that crupted in Kemphis on
