The signature on the card and the handwriting on the application have been identified by the Laboratory as Oswald's writing. Oswald is believed to have left New Orleans on the morning of 9-25-63 en route to Laredo, Texas, by bus. Details of his travel from New Orleans to Laredo have not as yet been determined. On the afternoon of 9-26-63 he entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo. Mexican Immigration officials there could furnish no information of value. However, records of the Flecha Moja (Red Arrow), a Mexican bus line, disclosed that Oswald was on Red Arrow bus 516 which departed Nuevo Laredo 2 p.m., 9-26 en route Mexico City. We are presently endeavoring to locate the driver and 18 passengers who were on this bus. Y On 10-2-63 Oswald traveled from Mexico City to Nuevo Laredo on the Transportes Frontera, a Mexican bus line. He arrived at Nuevo Laredo at 6 a.m., 10-3-63, where he was checked by a Mexican Immigration inspector who works the midnight to 8 a.m. shift. His method of travel from Nuevo Laredo to Dallas has not to date been established. Oswald's wife, who left New Orleans with Mrs. Paine shortly prior to Oswald's departure from New Orleans 9-25-63 has steadfastly denied any knowledge of Oswald's intention to go to Mexico City. 50 U.S.C ALLEGATION OF GILBERTO ALVARADO/UGARTE: 403)

Ugarte, a 23-year-old Nicaraguan, on 11-25-63 reported that on 9-18-63 he was present in the Cuban Consulate, Mexico City, where he observed Uswald receive \$6,500 as part payment to perform an assassination. He claimed to have repeatedly called the American Embassy between 9-18 and 11-22-63 to warn of the killing of an Important American. This claim is not substantiated by embassy records. Alle also claimed that he was in Mexico in September as an undercover agent

persisted in mis story and after being turned over to the Mexican authorities he, on 11-30-63, admitted in writing that his allegation was false; that he had never seen Oswald in the Cuban Consulate and never saw any money paid to anyone in that establishment. He told the Mexicans his motive in the fabrication was to induce the U.S. to take some action against Castro. When released by the (N Mexicans, Ugarte recanted his confession and claimed that he admitted the hoax only because of his fear of bodily harm. [Thereaf he was reinterrogated in Mexico by CIA and was afforded the polygraph examination in the presence of the Legal Attache, Mexico City. During reinterview on 12-6-63 he displayed evidences of deception when guestioned concerning Uswald. He admitted that he must have been mistaken in stating that he observed Uswald in the Cuban Consulate. The final report of the interview of Ugarte on 12-6-63 and the opinion of the polygraph operator have not been received to date. Alvarado was deported to Nicaragua on 12-9-63. Our investi-gation of Oswald has definitely established that he was in New Orleans from 9-17 through 9-25-63 and could not have been at the Cuban Consulate on 9-18-63 as alleged by Alvarado.
