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I told Ford in strict confidence that the Director concurred with his riempoint. I mentioned that our investigation thus far had conclusively shown that Oswald investigation was a loner. However, FBI investigation was still pending on a large number of rumors, speculation and gossip and it, therefore, would be quite unfair for the Commission to take a stand prior to tall the evidence being turned in. Ford stated this was his point entirely and that although he was a minority of one he intended to stick to his point.

Ford told me that John McCone, Director of CIA, had, approximately one week ago, gone up to his office and told him that CIA had uncovered some "startling information" In the Oswald case. We have had excellent relations with Congressman Ford for many year.
