Try using Google or some search engine to see what you get under Admiral George G. Burkley, JFK's White House Physician. Under Google for example one of the cites gives you Oral History and Burkley's somewhat extensive interview with a McHugh. Worth looking at but don't expect any great revelations. But perhaps some good color material.

Also get copy of Henry Hurt's Reasonable Doubt: An Investigation into the Assassination of John F. Kennedy. (a copy found in the Weisberg archive at Hood).

Also: Copy of official JFK's death certificate made out by Burkley. Its exclusion from the printed WC record. Why?

Burkley's promotion by LBJ. Do a search for in newspapers. Date and any explanation provided. Check with NY Times Index for 1963-4

Possibles: Admirals Calvin B. Galloway and Edward C. Kinney. Galloway was in charge of Bethesda Naval hosp. and Kinney was U.S. Navy Surgeon General.
