Parkland Doctors Who Were in Trauma Room One—What did they see?

News Conference transcript. Conference with doctors Perry and Clark. Point is to become familiar with Perry's description of JFK's neck wound. Was it one of entrance or exit according to Perry?

Check on Dr. Kemp Clark's WC Testimony. Vol. 6 begins p. 18. How does Clark describe JFK's head wound. Key here is the location of the wound according to Clark who was a neurosurgeon (a brain dr.) Do you find anything strange in the Specter's questioning?

What does Clark say about JFK's neck wound. Does he say that Perry received a call from Bethesda Dr. Humes the night of the JFK autopsy. What, if anything, does he say about a phone call. Some of this you can find in one of the assigned chapters in BOT. Probably the one on the autopsy.

There are a few contemporary records made by Harold Weisberg in his exchanges with Dr. Perry. Draw on anything you think useful.

Dr. Crenshaw, "Trauma Room One: The JFK Medical Coverup Exposed," see pps 61-70 for some first-hand accounts of what went on as the doctors tried to resuscitate JFK. Crenshaw was one of the 9 doctors in Trauma Room One. Read also pp. 109-113 for the immediate cone of silence that the hospital administration imposed on all of the staff.

You will need to review Dr. Perry's Warren Commission testimony. See Commission Volumes III and VI. Also see pp 209-211 from Crenshaw's "Trauma Room One." Be sure to check on Table 1 on p. 285 and Table 2 for consensus about JFK's massive head wound. See also p. 200 of Crenshaw book for Dr. Kemp Clark's description of the JFK head. Clark's description is especially important because he was a neurosurgeon. He operated on the brain.
