On October 9th, 1963, just one week before Oswald was to start his new job at the TSBD (JFK's rendezvous w/ destiny) an FBI agent took his Oswald's name off the federal alarm system that was about to identify him as a threat to national security.

Gheeling was his name. He was a supervisor in the Soviet espionage section of SOG.

He turned the alarm off on Oswald at the instant that it would have gone off.

Oswald was placed on the alert system after it was reported that Oswald told the US Embassy in Moscow when he arrived these in 1959 that he was give up military secrets to his new Soviet hosts (Richard Snyder/CIA).

What Oswald was referring to was the U-2 and its capabilities . . .

When the Hoover FBI learned of this Oswald was issued a Flash. . . . A wanted notice card was went throughout the Bureau. A "Wanted Notice Card" telling all Bureau offices that any agents coming across information on Oswald should notify the Espionage Section (Division Five).

The timing of Gheesling's action was on 12/9 silenced the alert system just at the about the time Oswald was alleged to have been in contact with the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City. . .

Why: Well, had Oswald's name gone out to all FBI offices he would not have been allowed to go to work on 11/22 or, if he did, he would have been placed on the Security Index and shadowed by SS agents. . . He would have been in a spot light. . . . and could not be put in the frame for shooting JFK. . . He could not have played the role of a Patsy.

Was this a case of the CIA manipulating the FBI. . . . (was this the CIA's doing????) When Hoover learned after the assassination what Gheesling did he order him to "Siberia," Detroit. . . .
