This is in response to your question as to whether this Office intends to investigate further the allegation made by Sandy Smith that after the assassination of President Kennedy, John P. Mohr instructed former SAC Gordon Shanklin to destroy the threatening note which Lee Harvey Oswald had delivered to the Dallas FBI Office. We have reviewed the initial FBI investigation of this allegation and have concluded that it is very improbable that further investigation of this allegation would lead to disciplinary action against present employees of the FBI. For that reason we think it would be inappropriate for this Office to conduct such an investigation.

We would, of course, appreciate being informed if the Criminal Division's investigation disclosed information indicating possible misconduct by present FBI employees.
