Since 2-24-64 our Dallas Office has established a lookout and a physical surveillance covering Marina Oswald. Since 2-29-64 we have had a technical surveillance on the telephone at her residence. Since 3-2-64 we have had a microphone surveillance in the residence itself.

(u) This coverage was instituted following a visit that Mr. J. Lee Rankin, General Counsel of the President's Commission, paid to the Director on 2-24-64. At that time Mr. Rankin noted that Marina Oswald was then living at the Fords (Declan Ford and his wife, Katherine) and presumably the Commission is going to want her back. Mr. Rankin stated he would hate to have her just run out on us, which is always a possibility, particularly down in Dallas and he was wondering about a stake-out on her which would watch her and see who is visiting her for a while. During this visit, Mr. Rankin stated that in connection with the stake-out we should use our own judgment but before terminating it to let him know. During this visit, the Director advised Mr. Rankin that we can also consider getting a telephone tap in there and he stated that we would get on it right away.

Very shortly thereafter it was learned that Marina Oswald had plans to move from the Fords and rent a residence of her own. She moved to 629 Beltline Road, Richardson, Texas, on 2-29-64 and by reason of this it was possible to institute the microphone surveillance which was installed on 3-2-64.

Since then, the expanded coverage has embraced Marina Oswald's dealings with her attorney, William McKenzie, and we have uncovered details of her negotiations with McKenzie. From a legal standpoint this is undesirable and it is possible that the Bureau at some future time could be criticized for this coverage.

While developing details of her dealings with her attorney, the technical, microphone and physical surveillances have not developed commensurate significant results concerning her contacts and activities.

ACTION:

(1) For the above reasons, it is recommended that Inspector Malley discuss this with J. Lee Rankin and advise him that we are discontinuing the physical surveillance and the technical surveillance.

Note (2) Since we have not advised the Commission concerning the microphone surveillance, we are discontinuing it on our own authority.
