Thereupon he said Mr. Pearson, "What welly happened?" Mr. Pearson said in effect that the whole affair had taken plane just as had been reported in the mesupepent and presumably by the Soviet Adoesador in Washington. Chairman Enrosbelary was atterly incredulous and his attitude was obspectorized by New, Pearson as being archetypical for every European I have ever talked to on this subject'.
