I called the Attorney Goneral at his home and advised him of the newslash announcing that the Fresident and Governor Connally of Texas had been shot in Pallas, today, while touring Dallas in an open car, and that the first newsflash indicated the shot was believed to be fatal. The Attorney General had not previously been advised of this.

I asked the Attorney General If there was anything we could do at Unline. He asked that we do whatever we could, and I told him we would get in touch with the Becret Fervice there.

1:48 p. m.

BAC Shanklin called from Pallas. Mr. Shanklin advised that & the only information the Lelias Office had was from the radio. According to the radio in Dallas, the fresident and the Governor were shot at the corner of Elm and Commerce Streets in a motor parade going out to the . place where they were to aprak. One witness said a Negro man leaned out a window and made two shots, and the police have the whole building surrounded. The Fresident and the Governor had been taken to Farkland flospital and the President was bleeding from the head.

I Instructed BAC Shanklin to get in touch with the Secret Service and offer assistance. Mr. Shanklin stated he had already done so. told hir. Shanklin to establish lictson with the local police.

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Memorandum for Mesers. Tolson, Belmont, Mohr, November 22, 1963 Conrad, De Loach, Evans, Rosen, Sallivan

I inquired as to the Governor's condition and Mr. Shankling indicated they had not reported on this. I inquired about the Vice President and Mr. Shanklin said the Vice President was in the parade but in a different car.

2:07 p. m.

BAC Shanklin called again and stated the President was in very poor condition but not dead. He said they had called in two priests.

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hir. Shanklin related that the shots came from the fourth floor. He stated the Dalias Cifice is unintaining liaison and has offered assistance. They do not know whether the shots were fired by a white person or a colored person. The first story was that a colored man leaned out of a window but they do not know; they are searching the whole building.

Mr. Shanklin advised that the Governor had been taken to an emergency operating room and the Fresident was in the general energency room. The last report was that the Fresident was in very, very critical condition but was still alive.

Mr. Shanklin inquired if the Aftorney General or anyone whom they should meet would be coming to Dallas. I advised hir. Shanklin I would let him know if the Aftorney General decided to travel to Dallas.

Mr. Shanklin advised he had just received word the Fresident was shot with a Winchester rifle.

2:10 p.m.

I called the Attorney General to advise him that the President was in very, very critical condition. The Attorney General then told me the President had died.

Regions condition; that here. Kennedy was not hurt and neither was Mrs. Connaily.

I told the Attorney General that the shot came from the fourth floor of a building and the building was completely surrounded now. I further advised him the Treeident was shot by a Winchester rifle. I stated the Dallas Office is working in every way to help the Secret Fervice and local police.

Fiemorandum for Messrs. Tolson, Belmost, Mohr, -- Conrad, DeLoach, Evans, Rosen, Sullivan

November 22, 1963

I inquired if the Attorney Ceneral intended to go to Palias and he stated he did not know exactly what he would do. I told him, if he decided to go down, to let one know and our office would meet him.

2:17 p.m.

Our Agents that President Kennedy had just died. They said this was not being put out yet.

I instructed hir. Chanklin to go all out on this and flud out who did it.

Air. Shanklin stated they had located 3 or 4 shalls in the building and the Sherill's Office had picked up one man.

I told Mr. Fhanklin to give every assistance we can there and do everything we possibly can there at the building.

hir. Shanklin sivied that a Secret Fervice agent had also been killed. Be stated they did not mention that at first but an Agent at the Folice Department advised that one died. He did not know the name of this Secret Service agent.

and he would cancel that. I advised him I thought he should cancel this.

he was going to do, that he may or may not go to Pallas, but I would let he. Shanklin know if the Attorney General decided to go to Pallas.
