Assistant Attorney General Norbert A. Schlel, Cilice of Legal Counsel, called. He stated he was drafting various forms of a proclamation for use by the new Fresident and wondered if I could tell him whether I had any incoviedge as to what kind of people murdered the President. He indicated the form of the proclamation might depend on whether these were made on, disappointed office seekers, represente some political point of view, were segregationist madmen, or just who they were.

I told Mr. Echlel I thought very probably we had in custody the man who killed the "resident in Dallas but this had not finitely been established. I advised hir. Echlei that Lee Harvey Jewald spent some years in Rousia, although he was born in America; that he tried unsuccessfully to renounce his American citizenship; and then came back here. I stated our intrast in Oswald came about from the fact that he had been apsociated with the Fair Play for Cuba Committee: that he was arrested in New Crieans some months ago for handing out leaflets in behalf of that committee. I told hir. Schlei that Uswald was working in the building from which the shots were fired; that we have the rifle and 3 copty shells found in the building in which the man was employed. I said Cawald apparently left this building and a block or 4. two away two police officers moved toward him, and for no good reason be opened fire on them and killed one. I told Mr. Schlei that the police have Uswald in custody and we are interrogating him at the present time. President Truman was by Faerio Ricans in the Nationalist Farty, which was the same group who opened fire in the House of Representatives from the gallery.

Concerning the assaultation of Fresident McKinley, I advised Mr. Schlei that Crolgosr, who killed Fresident McKinley, was a stadent of Emma Goldman and that I later prosecuted her for deportation from the United States. I said we did not eatch up with Emma Goldman until 1819, when we rounded up a group of anarchists and sent them back to Russia. I related that Czolgoss attended meetings at Goldman's home in Chicago, where she had a meeting place for people with anarchist views. I stated that Goldman was a well educated woman - self educated coming from the sweatshops of the New York garment district; that ahe wrote on many subjects and wrote well.

Indvised Mr. Schlei that almost all assassing had some imaginary grievance, usually of a polifical type - of either the anarchist viewpoint or the communist viewpoint. I stated the communists did not come into the picture uptil 1917.

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I said Dawald, if he were the man, would be in the category of being an extreme radical of the left; that he was a member of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee; that several of the leaders of this group have been indicted; but that this man never was a leader. I stated he was born an American but tried unsuccessfully to lose his American citizenship; came back to this country in 1902; made several trips to Lupa; upon his return each time we questioned him about what he went to Cuba for and he answered that it was none of our business. I said his working in this particular building where he was employed would lend credence to the fact that he may very likely he the man.

I advised A.r. Schiel that we have been getting leads from all over the country. I stated in California there is a story which has some substance which we are running down that a man made a statement to some woman at Long Eeach that the Fresident would be assassinated in Dallas today.

I also advised for. Schiel that Western Union has broughl to a our attention telegrams containing velled threats to the Fresident in the past several days.

be the one. I stated our Agents view him as a not as he freezes up and withdraws into himsolf when he is being questioned as he did this afternoon down in Dallas. I stated Oswald is the principal suspect is the case; we are trying to persuade blus to autouit to a polygraph examination; and as soon as the body arrives in Washington, we will determine whither the bullets have been taken out because we will need that in the trial of the case to tie in which the emply shells found by the gun. I informed Mr. Echlel that at the hospital in Fallas they were not certain the bullets had been taken out; that the body is going to be removed to the Bethesda Kaval Hospital and, if the ballets are still in the body, they will be removed.
